



## Looking for Birds on the Foothills Trail

Many users of the Foothills Trail may be unaware of a great resource that can help them learn what birds they may encounter. The international system eBird, operated by the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology, includes



seven “hotspots” for birds along the Foothills Trail.

You can look up each hotspot and find what birds have been seen there, including what species, how many individuals, and when each was seen. For example, you can look up the Alderton area of the Foothills Trail and see that one observer saw 23 species of birds there on Nov. 7, 2021. These included 12 Cackling Geese (a smaller cousin to the Canada Goose), 18 Eurasian Collared-Doves (an introduced species that has

only been in our area for a couple decades, but has rapidly increased in population), four California Scrub-Jays (a species rapidly expanding its range into our area), 14 Bushtits (one of our smallest birds), and one relatively uncommon Lincoln’s Sparrow. The previous report from the Alderton area hotspot was by three observers and included 24 species.

What may surprise you is the total number of species recorded at this hotspot: 111 species of birds! Yet some other hotspots, particularly the one labeled Foothills Trail – South Prairie to Crocker, has an amazing 174 species recorded there. The explanation for this remarkable number is that one of the top birders in Washington used to ride his bike there years ago when

# A Focus on Federal Funding

Passage of the \$1.2 trillion Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) is the big news out of DC, but is it a win? That depends. The League of American Bicyclists (LAB) lauds it because it includes an increase in funding for Transportation Alternatives, the largest pot of money that funds community bike/ped infrastructure, requires states to do Vulnerable Road User Safety Assessments, and helps fund creation of Complete Streets policies in local communities and more. Transportation for America (T4A), however, criticizes the IIJA because the Transportation Alternatives funding increase is a veritable drop in the bucket, highway and road building funding was greatly increased regardless of whether states are taking care of existing infrastructure or safety issues, and the law fails to address Climate Change in a meaningful way, when scientists are telling us we need a significant cut in carbon emissions. One thing is for sure though — it is law and sets out several funding formulas for the next five years, so we will work hard to make sure our local governments fully understand how to take advantage of funding for trails.

### Important Call to Action

There is still hope for improved federal funding for active recreation, mobility, transit, and climate response, though! The House just passed the Build Back Better Act which includes two new grant programs that are especially important for trail development:  
 Community Climate Incentive Grants: \$4 billion in grants for state and local projects that reduce carbon emissions, including zero-emission transportation options and those that reduce dependence on single-occupant vehicle trips.

Neighborhood Access and Equity Grants: \$4 billion in grants with eligibility for regional active-trans-

portation networks and spines connecting between communities, and explicitly creates a mechanism for ac-



tive-transportation connectivity grants.

A coalition of national organizations is calling on us all to contact our US Senators right NOW to tell them to: Pass the Build Back Better Act in the Senate. Include the Community Climate Incentive Grants & the Neighborhood Access and Equity Grants programs are included with the House funding levels (\$4 billion each) Ensure that trails are an eligible use of those grant funds in the Senate version (they are in the House version)

Please take a couple of minutes to contact our senators right now and spread the word to others to do so as well. We have a narrow window of time to make an impact on this legislation yet we could leave a legacy for generations in the trails we help fund:

he was a teenager. Most of the hotspots are not birded that frequently, so the total number of species for many are relatively low. Your observations can add to the database.

Here are the eBird hotspots designated as part of the Foothills Trail and the number of bird species recorded for each (as of Nov. 2021):

- Foothills Trail - Alderton area: 111 species
- Foothills Trail - Orting end bridge crossing: 80 species
- Foothills Trail - South Prairie to Crocker: 174 species
- Foothills Trail - Unmarked intersection (west of South Prairie): 50 species
- South Prairie Foothills Trail – bridge next to RV park: 62 species

- Foothills Trail - Four bridges area: 86 species
- Foothills Trail - Wilkeson to Carbonado: 65 species

Accessing the information is relatively simple. Go to [www.ebird.org/hotspots](http://www.ebird.org/hotspots), then enter the name Foothills Trail. All of the listed sites will pop up, along with a few from other states. Simply click on the site you want and it will take you to a map showing the location and an option to View Details. That will take you to a list of all the birds reported from that location, starting with the most recent date. Another option for Bar Charts will allow you to see in graphic form all the species that have been seen there and in what months they are most common.

# All Along the Riverwalk Festival Planned for June 2022

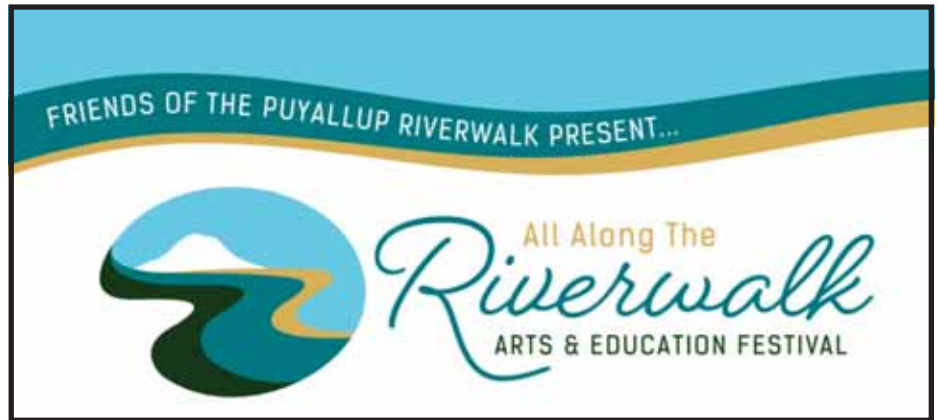
